BEST IN SHOW

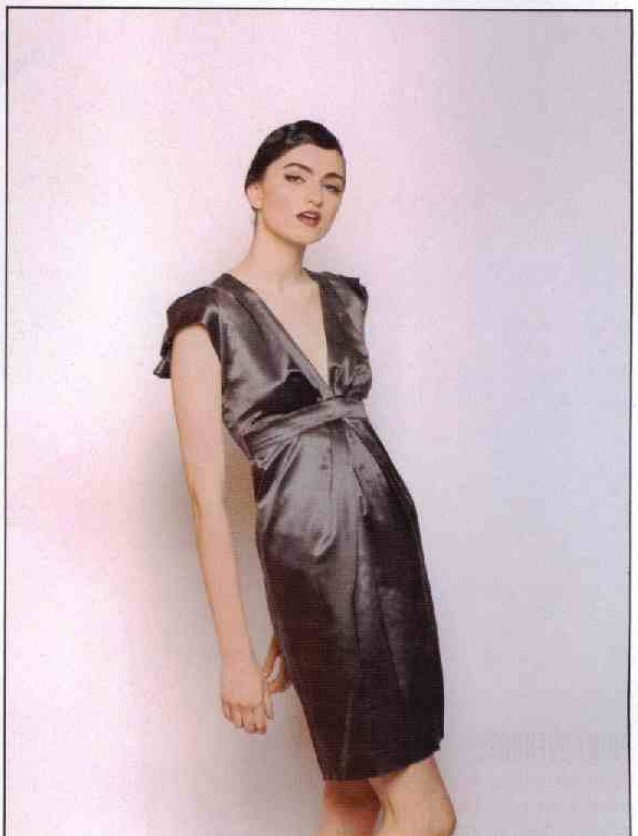
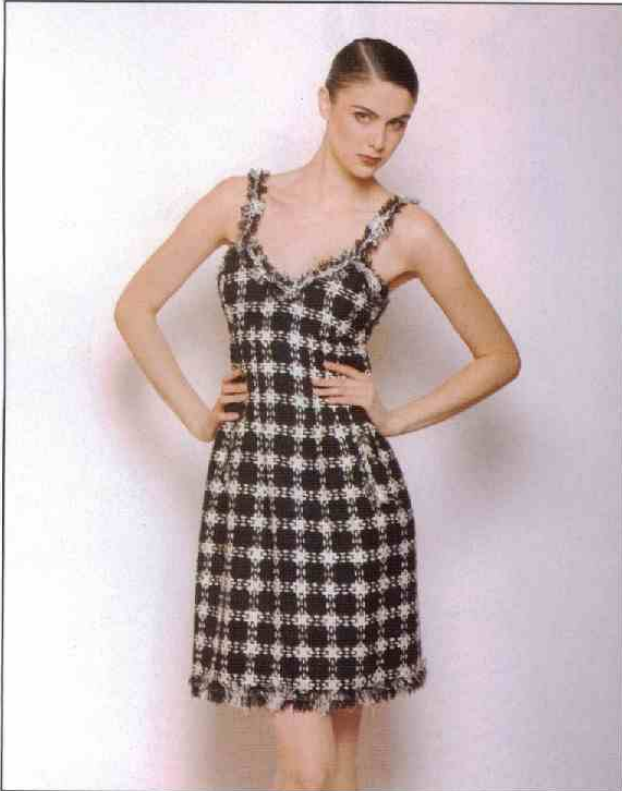
