Aramark secures €300k street cleaning contract

Aramark Ireland has secured a €300,000 contract with Dublin City Business Improvement District (BID) to provide cleaning services on 115 streets in Dublin city centre. Under the agreement, Aramark will supplement the cleaning services already provided by Dublin City Council in the BID.

It will provide power-washing services during the summer to remove staining, and pavement-gritting services in the winter in the event of heavy snowfall. The firm will operate a rapid response hotline, allowing businesses in the area to report urgent cleaning requirements, and has also un-

“Our crews will be working seven days to ensure Dublin city centre receives a rapid response to cleaning emergencies,” said Derry Robertson, general manager, Aramark Workplace Solutions.

“The cleaning team on the ground will be working 365 days of the year and will have up to ten cleaners every day carrying out scheduled work

on street vacuuming, power-washing and the removal of graffiti, chewing gum, cable ties and illegal posters. Also available is the emergency clean-up service for hazardous waste and emergencies.”

Dublin City BID is a not-for-profit organisation with responsibility for creating a welcoming and economically viable environment in the capi-

tal.

It represents 2,000 businesses and works with its partners to enhance the appeal of the city centre as a place for shopping, recreation and business development by increasing footfall and improving trading levels.
