Capital is not a litter blackspot

COMMERCE leaders in the capital have slammed reports the city is a litter blackspot.

Dublin City Business Improvement District fears tourism, revenue and jobs could be jeopardised by a recent report.

It said information on the cleanliness of the city was misleading and untrue.

It added the Irish Business Against Litter survey was amateur and included residential areas, presenting them as Dublin City Centre.

Dublin City BID chief Richard Guiney said a tourist considering visiting the capital could be misled into believing it is dirty.

He added: "The majority of Dublin's main tourist areas are recorded as clean."

He said the survey is "not representative of the true situation on the streets".
